If you could help your club out just once this year it would be greatly appreciated.

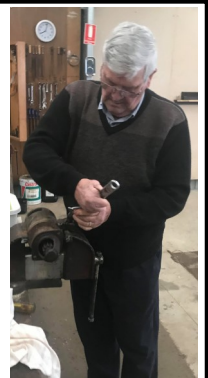
Rosters are available for the main jobs, please see us at the august meeting, zap an email or see the boys on Wednesday mornings at the club shed if you can help.

On behalf of the Northern Areas Restoration Club Kapunda Chapter, MAP KERNOW (Anything on wheels) will be open to all Motoring Clubs, Cars, Motor Bikes and Trucks 30 years old and over. On Sunday 31st October 2021 "Anything on wheels" will congregate at 9.30 a.m. for a "Meet and Greet" along with a BYO morning tea at 41 Hancock Road (Kapunda Harness Racing Club Car Park)) then departing around 10 a.m. for a tour through scenic, rolling farm countryside to Gill Park, HAMILTON, for a BBQ lunch. (Price not yet determined.) After lunch we will return to Kapunda (at 2pm) for a street procession and static display of "Anything on Wheels". In 2013 Corrine and I started volunteering in a ghost town called Farina, located between Marree and Lyndhurst

The volunteer program runs for eight weeks

between May and July, about thirty to forty volunteers do two week shifts, however due to border closures this year, they were running short of volunteers so we stayed on for four weeks. Corrine does bakery sales, I usually do stone masonry work on the ruins, this year due to a shortage of volunteers I did many jobs, rubbish collection refueling generators and general maintenance. All the money that the bakery makes goes back into the restoration projects. In 2013 bakery products were prepared and sold in a tent, then a large catering caravan was used, this year in a replica Patterson's house, the growth in sales over that period is unbelievable. Farina was surveyed in 1876 the Great Northern or Ghan railway reached it in 1882, due to a poor water supply the rail head was moved on to Marree in 1889. The population reached 300 with two hotels, during WW2 up to four trains a day passed through Farina, but after the war the town started to decline and by 1970 everyone was gone, except the sheep and cattle station owners, they still live there today. In 2009, Tom Harding, a tag along caravan operator from Victoria started the "Farina Restoration Group" after that they found that the Scottish bakers oven, built in 1888 last used in 1941, was still operational. look up www.farinarestoration.com for more
